
The CPMR at a glance

- Bringing together more than 150 Regions from 24
 States from the European Union and beyond.
- The CPMR campaigns in favour of a more balanced development of the European territory. It operates both as a think tank and as a lobby for Regions.
- Focuses on policies related to:
 - Social, economic and territorial cohesion
 - Maritime policies and blue growth
 - Transport and accessibility
 - Energy and climate change
 - Migration, neighbourhood and development
- Divided into six geographical commissions:

Atlantic Arc »
Balkan and Black Sea »
Baltic Sea »
Intermediterranean »
Islands »
North Sea »

The CPMR IMC & IC Policy position on the Nature Restoration Law

- First major legislative step since the Habitat Directive in 1992 and a major « move » for the Green Deal
- Final adoption voted by the EU Parliament 27th February 2024 next steps -> final vote by the EU Council
- Objectives: measures to promote the return of biodiversity to at least 20% of the land and sea areas of EU Member and restoration of at least 30% of certain habitats (forests, grasslands, wetlands, rivers, lakes and coral beds) by 2030, then 60% by 2040 and 90% by 2050.

The IMC & IC policy position:

- Underlines the **key role of the regions** in the elaboration of the **national restoration plans** and the implementation and monitoring stages of the NRL.
- Recalls the need to increase multilevel stakeholders' engagement at the earliest stage and in decision-making.
- Reminds to consider the integration of local/regional environmental plans and strategies and evaluate the specific needs and conditions of local ecosystems and communities, especially in islands.
- Expresses concerns about the access to funding, administrative barriers, capacity building resources and technical expertise to support an efficient implementation of the NRL at regional and local levels.

- Building up from the PANACeA (2016-2019)
 Interreg MED Horizontal project and followed by the Mediterranean Biodiversity
 Protection Community (2019-2022).
- The Ecosystem-based declaration signed at the European Parliament to engage European and Mediterranean institutions active in biodiversity protection, management science, practice and policy.

The CPMR IMC & IC Projects | MBPC SAIS EBSA Case study



- A series of 3 workshops from 2019 to 2022 looking at:
 - "<u>Managing Transboundary Impacts In Priority Areas</u>: Towards an Action Plan for Ecosystem-based Management (EBM) in the Southern Adriatic Sea Ecoregion" (2019).
 - Managing Transboundary Priority Areas: Towards a governance mechanism on the conservation of the south Adriatic-Ionian marine ecosystem" (2021).
 - Potential governance mechanism and action plan for the South Adriatic Ionian Strait Ecologically or Biologically Significant Marine Area (SAIS-EBSA) (2022).

Lessons learnt:

- Regions are key actors in conservation policy-making and their involvement is to be considered in Marine Spatial Planning processes.
- **Biodiversity knows no borders-** transboundary management is crucial to protect biodiversity.
- Need for concrete conservation measures and relevant regional stakeholders' engagement, including involvement by regional sectoral bodies such as the fishery and maritime traffic sectors.

 Blue Mission - act as the "Mission Restore our Ocean and Waters" Mediterranean Lighthouse. (Horizon Europe co-funded project

Partners: 6 R&I public institutions, 5 NGOs, 3 Mediterranean industrial associations and 2 SMEs from 7 countries of the Mediterranean.

Mission objective: reducing Mediterranean's hydrosphere pollution by 30-50 % by 2030.

How?

- Blue Mission engages **stakeholders from Policy, Business, Research&Innovation and Civil Society**, as well as the so-called **Ecosystem Enablers** to synergize the actions of the Mission Lighthouse in the Mediterranean basin.
- It supports the development and deployment of transformative innovative solutions in all forms: technological, social, business, governance.

Main actions by the CPMR IMC:

- Detecting existing gaps and barriers to apply innovative transformative solutions,
- Providing **policy recommendations and offering support** to orient **regional investments** (RIS3, Next Generation EU and projects) and relevant policies (e.g. EU Zero pollution, MSFD, WFD) towards the Mission objectives.

NaTour4CC - Governing sustainable tourism in territories with high environmental value: reconnecting tourism and nature for addressing the climate crisis with an ecosystem-based approach (Interreg Euro-MED project 2024-2026)

Partners: the Croatia Institute of Tourism, Sardinia Region, Crete Region, the Hellenic Society for the Protection of Nature, Plan Bleu, IUCN MED, Zadar County/Natura Jadera, Herzegovina Neretva County, Andalucia Region and the CPMR.

Main actions:

- Enable participating regions to assess their **priorities for climate change adaptation and mitigation**, applied to **sustainable tourism**.
- Deliver specific tourism climate action plans and testing nature-based solutions,
- Promote **cross-fertilization** among participating regions and destinations, to achieve and compare common methods, tested plans and solutions,
- Foster best practices and deliver policy recommendations at EU level.
