11:30 – 12:30 Panel I – Building South-North Mediterranean university alliances for a shared higher education space

Objective: Explore concrete institutional models and policy frameworks for building Euro-Mediterranean university alliances that support convergence in teaching, mobility, research, and innovation. This panel will showcase successful cooperation

platforms and examine the role of networks and EU funding in scaling them up.

Topics:

- Creating inclusive and sustainable South–North university alliances: motivations, models, and governance
- Institutional challenges in building long-term Euro-Mediterranean academic partnerships (mutual recognition of degrees, credit systems, and quality assurance frameworks)
- The role of regional networks (e.g., UNIMED, EUA, AARU, Tethys) in fostering inter-university collaboration
- Supporting institutional capacity-building in Southern Mediterranean universities
- From bilateral cooperation to multilateral integration: toward a shared Euro-Med higher education area.

Objective: Discuss how South-North Mediterranean university alliances can serve as drivers for structured academic mobility, brain circulation, and inclusive access to education. The panel will explore barriers to mobility, disparities in funding, and alignment with broader regional development policies.

Topics:

- The role of inter-university alliances in facilitating sustainable mobility schemes
- Gaps and limitations in Erasmus+ for Southern Mediterranean institutions
- Models of circular mobility and incentives for talent return
- Visa and recognition challenges
- Empowering youth and women through targeted exchange programs.

15:00 – 16:00 Panel III: Advancing research and innovation integration through Euro-Mediterranean alliances

Objective: Explore how Euro-Mediterranean university alliances can facilitate collaborative research, innovation transfer, and alignment with EU priorities. Emphasis will be placed on building a shared R&I ecosystem across the Mediterranean and linking academic work to economic and societal needs.

Topics:

- Strengthening cross-border research through university consortia
- Facilitating Southern Mediterranean access to Horizon Europe and PRIMA
- Fostering inclusive R&I agendas (digitalisation, sustainability, climate)
- University-business-policy cooperation and innovation diplomacy. The potential role of a Euro-Mediterranean Business & Innovation Chamber.
- Enhancing participation of women and early-career researchers in Euro-Med R&I
