## **Conference Conclusions**

There is already a wide range of **collaborative activities** taking place among universities in Southeast Europe and the Western Balkans. However, there remains **significant untapped potential** to deepen and improve these partnerships. The **Rectors' Forum of Southeast European and Western Balkan universities** continues to play a key role in fostering cooperation, within the scope of its available resources.

The European Union has made various funding instruments available to these non-EU countries – such as WIDENING, INTERREG, Horizon Europe (HE), IPA, and WBIF – demonstrating a clear commitment to supporting their integration. Nevertheless, **further efforts and targeted initiatives** are needed to maximise the impact of these opportunities. At the same time, countries in the region **must continue aligning with EU standards across all sectors** in order to fully benefit from and contribute to European integration.

The event, **co-organised** by the **Slovenian Business and Research Association (SBRA)** and the **University of Ljubljana**, underscored the shared will – and indeed the necessity – for closer cooperation between universities in the region. Participants expressed strong and unified **support for the University of Belgrade** during its current period of difficulty.

Speakers represented academic institutions not only from Slovenia, Croatia, Serbia, and Montenegro, but also from Italy and Germany. In addition, key representatives from European institutions were present, including the European Quality Assurance Register, the European Students' Union, and – most notably – EU Commissioner Ekaterina Zaharieva.

EU Commissioner Zaharieva emphasised the importance of strengthened collaboration between the Western Balkans and the EU and shared notable updates on the forthcoming FP10 programme and the establishment of the Competitiveness Fund. She also voiced her support for the University of Belgrade and reaffirmed the EU's commitment to the region.

The Rectors' Forum reaffirmed its support for EU enlargement towards **Southeast Europe and the Western Balkans** and called for continued **institutional and financial support** to reinforce **academic and research ties** across the region.
