
Valorisation of R&D (H2020)

- Lighthouse projects (~100 M€/year; ~4 projects/year; total of ~500M € /7 years)
- CSAs (Espresso, CityKeys, etc.)



Green Digital Charter (GDC)

Disaster Resilience & Climate Change



53 European cities / 21 countries / 27 M citizens

Commitments:

- Promote the best applications and results of ICT solutions
- Establish local partnerships to implement the GDC's commitments
- Deploy five large-scale and replicable ICT pilots per city within five years
- Decrease the direct carbon footprint of the ICT sector by 30% per city within ten years





Interoperability and standardisation Urban digital platforms

 Minimal but sufficient common open standards and specifications will support large-scale implementation, replication and building a market for bankable smart city solutions

Commission

- Interoperability mechanisms avoid vendor lockin
- Ability to handle a multitude of data flows and stakeholders and easily implement all kinds of urban digital solutions
- Respecting citizens' digital rights
- Sharing and re-using solutions to save time, money and reduce time to market
- Aggregate demand with better chances to attract investments

Digital Europe Programme

- Focused on
 - building the strategic digital capacities of the EU
 - facilitating the wide deployment of digital technologies
- Clean, sustainable and smart Communities and Mobility
 - Priority actions for the first two years
 - Deployment of Open Cross-sectorial Urban Platforms and Crossborder Mobility as a Service (MaaS) solutions
 - Deployment of innovative smart city and smart mobility applications by SMEs and start-ups
 - Testing and experimentation facilities (TEF)

Digital Innovation Hubs will also be used as essential instruments of the implementation of urban digital platforms and the large scale roll-out of AI-driven services in areas such as Smart Energy, Smart Mobility, waste and e-government



Horizon Europe

- Intervention area on Smart Cities (but also Smart buildings, mobility, etc.)
- Mission on Climate Neutral and Smart Cities
 - One of 5 in Horizon Europe
 - Cross-cutting
 - "Managing" 10% of budget
 - 15 Board members
 - 30 assembly members
 - Deliver missions descriptions and output document by year end
