2010, the European Commission called on governments to develop Smart Specialisation Strategies (S3).

Regulation on the European Regional Development Fund and on the Cohesion Fund (EU) 2021/1058

Support from the ERDF under policy objective 1 (PO 1) should be based on building capacities for smart specialisation strategies...

Article 22 :(vi) Content of programmes Each programme shall set out for each specific objective the interregional, cross-border and transnational actions with beneficiaries located in at least one other Member State or outside the Union.

New ENABLING CONDITION FOR SMART SPECIALISATION Policy objective 1. A more competitive and smarter Europe by promoting innovative and smart economic transformation and regional ICT connectivity

Specific objective ERDF: Specific objectives 1.1 and 1.4 under this policy objective

Name of enabling condition Good governance of national or regional smart specialisation strategy



New thematic enabling condition "Good governance of national or regional smart specialisation strategy" - seven fulfilment criteria:

1. Up-to-date analysis of challenges for innovation diffusion and digitalisation.

2. Existence of competent regional or national institution or body, responsible for the management of the smart specialisation strategy.

3. Monitoring and evaluation tools to measure performance towards the objective of the strategy.



4. Functioning of stakeholder co-operation ("entrepreneurial discovery process").

5. Actions necessary to improve national or regional research and innovation system, where relevant.

6. Where relevant, actions to support industrial transition.

7. Measures for enhancing cooperation with partners outside a given Member State in priority areas supported by the smart specialisation strategy.

The S3 Working Group on Interregional Collaboration start operating in May 2023

- collect and document knowledge and good practices in different European regions

- identify common needs, problems, and challenges
- co-develop, support, deploy and monitor solutions to such challenges

- meet twice a year, for three years, and comprise experts from the quadruple helix.

Outcomes will be published and elaborated to ensure that they can be of support to all EU regions.
