For many years, the Kujawsko-Pomorkie Region has been supporting the development of young people, encouraging them to be active, socially engaged, and responsible citizens.



Youth Regional Assembly

The Youth Regional Assembly is a forum for young residents aged 16–21 to learn how local government works, speak on regional issues, and cooperate with adult councillors. They organize projects, youth congresses, and promote intergenerational dialogue.



Civic Education Lessons

Students from schools visit the Marshal's Office in Toruń, participate in mock votes, meet councillors, and see how decisions are made. It's a great way to learn democracy through experience.

Scholarship Programs

Programs like 'Prymus Pomorza i Kujaw Plus' and sports scholarships help talented students and young athletes develop their passions regardless of financial situation.



Youth Clubs and Local Initiatives

EU-funded youth clubs provide spaces for young people to develop their interests, join workshops, learn new skills, and engage socially. The goal is to support cooperation and civic participation.



What is ToMUN?

ToMUN is an annual simulation of the United Nations organized by I High School of Nicolaus Copernicus in Toruń. Students represent different countries and debate in English on global challenges such as climate change, human rights, and sustainable development.





International Dimension

ToMUN gathers around 300 participants from Poland and abroad. Foreign students stay with Polish families, building friendships and cultural bridges. Toruń – a UNESCO World Heritage city – provides the perfect setting for such cooperation.



Educational Impact

ToMUN promotes EU values – dialogue, democracy, and cooperation beyond borders. It inspires students to pursue diplomacy, law, or civic engagement, and helps develop empathy and critical thinking.

Future Plans – European Parliament Simulation

Building on ToMUN's success, we are planning a new project – a simulation of the European Parliament. It will focus on youth policy and local participation, helping young people voice their needs and supporting local governments in developing youth strategies.
