## Mission on Cancer

#### **Challenges**

- 2.7 million people in the EU are diagnosed each year
- 1.3 million people die from cancer each year
- Total cost of cancer in Europe in 2018: €199 billion
- Impact of COVID-19 pandemic and war in Ukraine

#### **Four Mission objectives**

- 1. Understanding cancer
- 2. Prevention & early detection
- 3. Diagnosis and treatment
- 4. Quality of life

18 R&I priority areas, 4 transversal R&I priorities: equity, innovation, childhood cancer and personalised medicine

EUR 378.2 million 2021-2023 Joint governance



Improve the lives of more than 3 million people by 2030, through prevention, cure and for those affected by cancer including their families, to live longer and better, jointly with the Europe's Beating Cancer Plan

#### **Objective:**

To collect, share and analyse research and patient cancer data + other relevant data to gain new and deeper understanding of cancer mechanisms, focusing on poorly-understood cancers

#### Main expected features:

- Federated platform of national cancer data hubs utilising existing, relevant research infrastructures
- (also) fed by R&I actions
- Integration with other data platforms, such as the European Cancer Patient Digital Centre

## **European Cancer Patient Digital Centre**







Information and support for cancer patients, survivors and their families



#### Main expected features:

- EU virtual network of national infrastructures of patientcontrolled health data
- All national nodes have common features + country-specific functions + connection to cancer registries











## Cancer Mission: new initiatives to boost engagement

### Fostering new dialogues with and within Member States:

- *EU level*: health and research ministries work together in **joint cancer subgroup** under the Public Health Expert Group (PHEG) to ensure scientific evidence systematically informs policy development;
- National & regional levels: future National Cancer Mission Hubs will engage national stakeholders in policy dialogues on cancer.

## Promoting citizen engagement around cancer:

- Focus groups on cancer prevention early detection and screening (2022)
- **Dialogue with young cancer survivors**, incl. future creation of platform (2023)
- **Bus roadshow** to raise awareness on cancer prevention and screening (2024)

  - Deliver scientific advice for the overall implementation of the Europe's Beating Cancer Plan.



#### Mission activities:

- Mission WP2023 topic best practices and tools to improve the quality of life for childhood cancer patients, survivors and their families in European regions
- Workshops with young cancer survivors/parents (11-12 Jan, 6 Feb. 2023)
- Conference "Addressing the Needs of Young Cancer Survivors" (7 Feb. 2023)
- Follow-up workshop to co-create future actions on late effects (23 May 2023)
- Workshop with patient organisations to explore areas of cooperation (15 Dec. 2023)
