- 3. Supporting STI policy, frameworks and governance.

- Focus on Sub Saharan Africa
- Maintain ambitions in other regions (LAC, Asia)
- Level of interventions: country, regional global





ACP Programme to Strengthen R&I Capacity: €60M (EDF 11, ongoing)

ACP Innovation Fund

Contribute to a conducive and inclusive environment for research and innovation



Policy Support Facility

Enhance the quality of research and innovation policies and systems (demand driven)

Research and Innovation Hub

Facilitate access to, sharing and transfer of information and knowledge



ACP Innovation Fund: €50.4M Priorities



Grants to advance solutions to the 4 cross-sector challenges:

- ☑ Digital literacy, knowledge and use of emerging technologies
- ☑ R&I skills development and labour market demand
- ✓ Synergies in the R&I ecosystem, technology transfer, R&I uptake
- ☑ Local and indigenous knowledge

ARISE Pilot Programme: €25M

The African Research Initiative for Scientific Excellence (ARISE) Pilot Programme aims at strengthening Africa's science base by increasing the quality of research and the number of researchers in Africa



45 African researchers hosted by higher education or research institutions in 38 African countries



Up to €500,000 per grant, up to 5 years

Intra-Africa Academic Mobility Scheme (Phase V)



- Linking at least 4 HEIs (including applicant) from Africa and 1 technical partner from EU
- 4 calls organised between 2016 and 2020
- 28 partnerships selected
- Budget: between 1 and 1.4 M€

Objectives

- increase the employability of students;
- improve the quality of higher education in Africa and its relevance to Africa development vision
- strengthen modernisation and internationalisation of African higher education Institutions
- promote the development of an African higher education and research space
