

- > 50% budget to Community-building actions and integrative activities;
 - Strengthening the European Research Area on rare diseases R&I
 - Clinical Research Network for clinical trial preparedness
 - Diagnostic pipeline
 - Implement multi-country clinical trials
 - Boost public-private collaboration
 - Accelerate ATMPs development
